

**EQUINOX HAND DYE**  
**Crochet Keyhole Scarf**



**Approx. Measurements: 34" x 6"**

**Materials:**

**Equinox Hand Dye:** 1—50g skein,  
color 101 Sepia Sunset

**Gauge:** 18 DCs and 10 rows = 4"

**Hook:** Crochet hook **F-5** (3.75mm)

This scarf begins at the center and is worked out on either side.

2 rows of DCs on each side form a base for 4 mesh rows.

**CH 136** very loosely. Turn.

Row 1: Insert hook into the 4th CH from the hook and DC. continue to DC in each CH across the row. Turn.

Row 2: CH 3 (counts as a DC), skip the first DC and DC across all DCs in the previous row. Work the last DC into the top of the turning CH. [134 DCs] Turn.

Row 3: CH 3, skip 1 DC, DC in next 3 sts, \*CH 3, skip 3 sts, DC in next 3 sts, Repeat from \* CH 3, skip 3 DCs and work a DC into the turning CH. Turn.

Row 4: CH 3, \*3 DCs in the CH 3 loop, CH 3, skip 3 DCs. Repeat from \*, DC in the turning CH.

Repeat Row 4 twice. Fasten off.

Return to the beginning CH section and start at either end.

Row 1: Working into the other side of the CHs, insert hook into the first CH and CH 3, DC in 18 sts; CH 9, skip 9 CHs; DC in each st to the end of the row. [134 DCs]. Turn.

Beginning with Row 2, work all rows as you did on the other side.

Although blocking is not necessary, it enhances the mesh portions of the scarf. Submerge the scarf in lukewarm water. After gently wringing it out, roll it in a towel to remove excess moisture. Place it on a flat surface to dry shaping the mesh areas.

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
